Touro University California***EDU716: Reading/Writing Educational Literature***

Reading and Writing Educational Research is part of the research core completed by students pursuing the Master of Arts in Education degree. EDU716 immerses the MA candidate in reading and analyzing the current theoretical and empirical literature on an educational topic connected to his/her MA project or thesis. Students are expected to define their topic and write a literature review in anticipation of their Master's project or thesis. This course incorporates writing instruction, practice, and support for students undertaking graduate study in order to acquire the conventions of academic writing expected of Masters level students.

EDUC 795 Master's Thesis/Project Seminar

The Master's Thesis/Project Seminar provides support and direction during the development and completion of the thesis requirement for a Master's degree in Education. The thesis requirement may be fulfilled either through a research study or an applied project with the approval of the thesis advisor. Students who do not complete the thesis requirement during this course are required to enroll in EDUC 796 each semester until their thesis requirement for the degree is met.

Boise State University***EDTECH537/597: Blogging in the Classroom***

This course will focus on the use of blogs in education, including creating and maintaining blogs, using RSS readers and microblogging. Students will examine the nature and purpose of blogging, including the differences between blogging for personal/professional development and blogging as a classroom activity. Additional topics will include the various types of blog entries, blog promotion, disclosure guidelines, and building a blogging community as a part of a personal/professional learning network.

Sacred Heart University***EDL626: Assessment & Evaluation of Learning – Qualitative and Quantitative Analysis***

Focuses on interpretation of psycho-educational assessment data, and the translation of those data into instructional plans. Current tests as well as methods of data analysis are examined. Statistical methods of analyzing and tracking test data, including trend analysis, are utilized.

EDL689: Review of Educational Leadership Literature

This course is designed to provide candidates with the knowledge and skills required to conduct a systematic review of educational literature. Candidates will be taught how to perform each step of the review process and will then apply it to a topic of their choosing. Finally, candidates will gain a basic conceptual foundation to research philosophy, terminology, methods, and practices.

EDL 690: Educational Research Seminar

This course is designed to increase student awareness of educational research techniques; specifically to enhance classroom effectiveness by making administrators better consumers of educational literature. Students read and critique qualitative and quantitative educational literature. Experimental and quasi-experimental designs are examined and statistical techniques are discussed. A research study is started and moves through methodological design.

EDL691: Thesis Seminar

A seminar format is utilized to offer direction and advice to those students preparing to submit a thesis for the culmination of the Certificate of Advanced Studies program (focus on implementation of and conclusion of the research project).

EDL696: 092 Administrative Certification Program – Internship I

The purpose of the Educational Leadership Program at Sacred Heart University is to develop educational leaders who can meet the challenges of educating preK-12 students in a complex and diverse society. The 092 Administrative Certification Internship I will require interns to demonstrate knowledge and skills based on the Common Core of Leading: Connecticut School Leadership Standards (CSLS) and the ELCC Program Standards for Educational Leadership. Since the CSLS are in close alignment with the ELCC Standards, the candidate will use the ELCC standards when planning the internship activities.

EDL698: Administrative Practicum – The Internship

Students will undertake a practicum for fulfillment of the terminal requirement for certification. Students submit a proposal for a district/school-based project that addresses an identified need. Further details will be available through the student's advisor.

Wayne State University*ED7999: Terminal Master's Project*

This class is taken at the end of a student's coursework toward a Masters. The Masters Project should reflect the knowledge and skills that you have acquired in the Instructional Technology Program. As you select a suitable topic, you should think of how that topic will demonstrate those skills. This project is displayed at a Poster Session.

EER7870/EER7900: Fundamentals of Qualitative Research

Fundamentals of epistemological issues, educational perspectives of qualitative research and research design. Readings in qualitative research. Conducting the case study, personal history, and cognitive study. Overview of methods for analyzing talk, text, and interaction.

EER8700: Advanced Qualitative Evaluation: Theory and Practice

Major paradigms of qualitative evaluation, strategies of inquiry, methods of collecting and analyzing materials, the art of interpretation. analysis of real data, including pattern coding, data displays, checklist matrices, transcription, explanation prediction within-case vs cross-case displays, ethical issues in evaluation. Computer use in qualitative evaluation.

EER8900: Qualitative Design for School Research

Field Placement. Integration of theory with practice for conducting, analyzing, and reporting qualitative research or evaluation in the schools.

IT6110: Foundations of Instructional Systems Design

Alternative systems models of instructional design; basic design principles, methods and techniques of pre-design analysis; instructional strategy selection and sequencing.

IT6140: Designing Web Tools for the Classroom

Design, development and evaluation of learning experiences using the World Wide Web. Student creates and evaluates learning activities using the Web; creation of personal learning portal. Basics of HTML and common authoring tools.

IT6230: Internet in the Classroom

Developing problem-based instruction by integrating the Internet into the curriculum and lessons. Students examine models for lesson development and investigate how the Internet may be used as a resource in those lessons.

IT8100: Background, Issues and Trends in Instructional Technology

History of instructional technology practice and intellectual foundations; implication for current issues. Factors likely to affect the future of the field, including contributions of key leaders. Electronic communication techniques used to explore issues with others in the field.

IT8180: Readings in Instructional Technology

Individually-paced course: investigation of recent research studies and theoretical essays in the field.

EDIT2000: Introduction to Technology for Teachers

The computer and its educational applications for pre-service teachers. Computer-based education in the areas of instruction, text and data processing, multimedia, and telecommunications. Emphasis on integrating computer tools into class instruction.

EDIT2010: Basic Instructional Technology

Introduces the use of a variety of resources in teaching. Design and creation of products for learning environments using various technologies.

EDIT4170/6170: Instructional Design

Systematic procedures for designing, developing, evaluating, and revising instruction to meet identified goals and objectives.

EDIT6180: Instructional Development

Developing instructional materials for a defined context applying a learner-centered, systematic design philosophy. Working within a team environment while applying contemporary learning theories. Engaging in situational assessment, learner analysis, performance specification, test construction, strategies selection, materials design, and evaluation.

EDIT6190: Design and Development Tools

Students learn a variety of tools appropriate for computer-based development. These include graphics, media, and software development tools. Students are required to write a contract for the specific tools to be learned.

EDIT6600: Multicultural Perspectives on Technology

Investigation of the policies, motivations, and beliefs surrounding the use of technology in educational systems around the globe. Students will learn to recognize, analyze, and benefit from different perspectives on the use and meaning of technology in educational contexts.

EDIT9990: Doctoral Topical Seminar

This seminar is designed to allow its participants to explore the roots of the field of Instructional Technology by reading original works of the pioneers of the field from the past 80 years and interpreting the implications of these contributions for teaching and learning in the 21st Century.

ESOC2450: Initial Field Experience in Social Science Education

The Initial Field Experience is designed as an introduction to curriculum and instruction in secondary social studies. Students will document observations of the school context, administration, teachers, students, and resources available for instruction. In addition, students will explore questions about the nature, purpose, and practices of social studies in the modern school curriculum. Students will develop an initial rationale for teaching social studies.

ESOC3420: Early Childhood Social Studies

Social studies curriculum and instruction for young children; content selection, lesson and unit planning, teaching methods, materials, and evaluation strategies.

ESOC4000 Special Problems in Social Science Education

This course focuses on the instructional uses of role playing, simulations and games within K-12 social studies. Students will develop skills in the technique of role playing. Students will also consider the planning and implementation of traditional and computer-based simulations. Finally, traditional, computer-based, and online games will be examined as a potential tool.

ESOC5460: Social Science Education Student Teaching

Teaching social studies in the middle or secondary grades under supervision of school and university professional personnel.

ESOC5520: Teaching Politics, Government, and Civics

Rationale for and resources in political science and civic/citizenship education, the role of teachers and schools in political socialization, and teaching procedures for instruction on state and local citizenship in middle grades and high schools.

ESOC5560: Social Science Education Student Teaching Seminar

Offered concurrently with Student Teaching in Social Science Education, the course examines issues related to aims, persistent problems, theoretical arguments, and research findings in field experiences. The course features a technological component supporting the completion of teaching portfolios, the capstone assignment in the certification program.
